We are fortunate that we have Bishop Clive Handford and Revd Angela Cooper living in the benefice. They will be leading most of our regular worship and officiating at Baptisms, Weddings and Funerals.

I wonder how many New Year resolutions are still intact. Well, whether or not they are still operative there is another opportunity.

We are soon to enter the season of Lent, the most solemn time in the Christian Year. There is a centuries old tradition of giving up something for Lent. Some people each year give up alcohol. Children have been known to say "Yes, but not chocolate"! Whatever we give up, it should not be something too easy. There needs to be at least some sacrifice in it. Each time we say "No" to ourselves can prompt a thought about Jesus's own fasting and temptation which we traditionally remember on the First Sunday of Lent. It can help us remember his sacrifice for us. We may recall those many in the world who do not have the luxury of fasting.

While giving up something has usually been thought of as a way we mark Lent, an alternative, or better an additional way, is doing something positive. There is a wide range of possibilities. Just two examples might be undertaking some study exercise or giving more to a food bank.

Lent begins on Ash Wednesday which this year falls on 14th February. That is also traditionally St Valentine's Day. Keeping both in a mutually authentic way may prove a challenge!

One last thought. Jesus said that when you fast you should do it privately and not make it obvious to everyone. In other words, don't point to yourself. It should be what might be called "Secret religion".

However you keep it, have a good and positive Lent.



Some Lent/Easter Words

"Shrove" (as in Shrove Tuesday, Feb 13) – linked to "shrive" or "shriven": confessing your sins and being forgiven by a priest.

"Lent" (starts on Feb 14) – shortened form of an Old English word meaning "spring season".

"Ashing" (as in Ash Wednesday, Feb 14) – the ashes are created by burning palms from the previous year's Palm Sunday and symbolise mortality (dust-to-dust).

"Mothering" (as in Mothering Sunday, March 10) – can refer to our own mothers; or "mother" church; or Mary, mother of Jesus.

"Palm" (as in Palm Sunday, March 24) – palm branches were waved to welcome Jesus on his entry to Jerusalem.

"Maundy" (as in Maundy Thursday, March 28) – from the Latin "mandatum", meaning a command; Jesus *commanded* his disciples to love each other.

"Easter" (Easter Sunday, March 31) - possibly derived from "Eostre", a pagan goddess associated with spring and fertility.

Jeel Scholarship Fund Cathedral Pilgrimage

Dorothy Gray and Clare Slator are intending to visit all 42 of England's Anglican Cathedrals to publicise this charity. Clare has visited Palestine many times and met the students that JSF supports.

Inspired and created by Revd. Alison Askew, JSF provides further education grants to school leavers at Jeel Al Amal, one of McCabe Educational Trust supported projects. Jeel Al Amal is a Christian organisation that cares for young people, regardless of their religion, at a day and residential school near Bethany in Palestine.

We wrote to the cathedrals before visiting and our first trip was to Newcastle and Durham where we were enthusiastically welcomed. We left them information about our students and how to sponsor them.

We drove first to Newcastle Cathedral to meet Dean Lee. The Dean, who has visited Jeel twice, gave us a guided tour of St Nicholas Cathedral. The only cathedral in England to be named after Santa Claus! The Cathedral, though small compared with Durham, is doing some amazing work with homeless people and their Café 16 is staffed by prison leavers, mentored by the Oswin Project. The cakes are baked in HMP Northumberland.



Dorothy, Scout the collie, I and of course my dog Kit then walked the Pilgrim route from Jesmond to the cathedral and back taking in the remains of St Mary's Chapel which was one of the most important Pilgrim places in the 15th Century.

We moved on to Durham, leaving the dogs in the car, for a walk through the town up to the stupendous cathedral.



We had our photos taken next to the sanctuary knocker and entered, passing the Venerable Bede's burial site. Passing the memorial to the miners I took a photo as it is hewn in a black coal like wood. The miners did risk their lives and it seemed a fitting memorial.

The café here had to be visited, for research purposes, but the cheese scone was taken home for a member of the backup team who declared it almost as good as one of Rose's!

St Cuthbert's remains and St Oswald's head are buried behind the altar in a very peaceful, prayerful chapel. We took time to light candles and pray. It was a good way to finish our first day of Pilgrimage.


Worship and Teaching: Embedding creation care in worship, prayer, and learning.
